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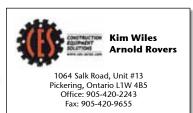

What is offered through the Market Monitor?

General and associate members who sign up for the basic annual subscription, which costs \$100, receive:

These are broken out by rental segment – construction and industrial equipment, general tool, and party and event.

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Tell us how you have been impacted by equipment theft

Theft: It impacts rental operators in so many ways. In addition to the outright theft from your operation or job site, there is equipment theft (or theft by conversion) in which equipment is not returned after the expiration of the rental agreement, and there is theft of service when equipment is returned after the expiration of the rental agreement without payment of applicable rental charges.

These two types of theft are more prevalent than many realize. When they occur, these thefts rob rental operations of not only the equipment but also substantial rental revenue from the current holder of the equipment and from potential renters who would have been able to use the equipment if you had it in your inventory.

Canada does not have clear laws that address equipment theft (conversion) or theft of service

Because there are no clear laws in Canada to address this issue, Canadian rental operators do not have much recourse to right this wrong. The Canadian Rental Association (CRA) wants to change this.

According to CRA President

Andrew Paquette, owner of Bravo Rentals in Montreal, "CRA is pursuing with authorized parties to develop more understanding and knowledge of how theft by conversion affects rental operations," noting that this is the first step in trying to show legislators the need for an actual law that punishes these types of thefts.

CRA already has contacted the American Rental Association (ARA) "because of its experience in increasing awareness among legislators in various states about this issue," Paquette says, adding that many states now have laws in place that directly address equipment, or conversion, theft and theft of service violations. These laws advance such offenses from being civil disputes and make them actual crimes.

Many U.S. states have laws addressing these specific types of theft

For instance, the Texas Legislature has adopted strong theft statutes:

Equipment theft or theft by conversion is addressed in the Texas Penal Code §31.03. This code states:

(a)"A person commits an offense if he unlawfully appropriates property with intent to deprive the owner of property.

(b)"Appropriation of property is unlawful if: (1) it is without the owner's effective consent; ..."

Theft of service is addressed in Penal Code §31.04 (a) and defines who commits theft of service and the steps that must be followed before anyone can be prosecuted under

this section. It states that:

"A person commits theft of service, if, with intent to avoid payment for service that he knows is provided only for compensation ... (3) having control of personal property under a written rental agreement, he holds the property beyond the expiration of the rental period without effective consent of the owner ... thereby depriving the owner of the property of its use in further rentals."

Theft of service occurs when equipment has been returned

after the expiration of the agreement without payment or applicable rental charges. Intent to avoid payment must be established.

Through national credit bureau Experian, ARA's program offers both general and associate members four types of U.S. business reports and one consolidated Canadian report. Each easy-to-read report offers important credit risk information that can help you determine creditworthiness so you can make an educated decision about extending credit.

When you order throughout April, you will save US\$5 off the regular member price of each report, thanks to ARA's Product of the Month program. So, if you haven't tried ARA's program, now is the time to check it out and save while doing so.

To order, download the credit report form online by going to the "ARA Members Only" section of www.ARArental.org. Once there, click on "Business Resources" and then "Credit Report Service." During weekday business hours of 8 a.m. to 5 p.m., Central time, you usually will receive reports within an hour of your faxed request and often as soon as 15 minutes. Firsttime orders of reports containing Fair Credit Report Act (FCRA)regulated information might take a little longer.
